

Canadian per-capita consumption of pipe, snuff, chewing tobacco and cigars 1998-2007

Canadian per capita consumption of cigarettes and fine-cut tobacco is over 100 times greater than the use of cigars, snuff, pipe and chewing tobacco. These four tobacco products represent 3.5% of the total tobacco consumption from 1998 to 2007.

Snuff, pipe and chewing tobacco consumption is low, and has declined steadily since 1998, in contrast to cigar consumption which has been rising since 2004. This trend can be attributed to the growing cigarillo popularity, especially among youth. According to the 2007 Canadian Tobacco Use Monitoring Survey (CTUMS), cigarillos have become very popular among adolescents. When cigarillo use is included in smoking prevalence statistics for youth aged 15-19 in 2007, smoking rates increase from 15% to 20%.

For the period 1998-2003, cigars were reported in weight, not units. To allow comparability with later years, a conversion to units was required. We estimated a conversion factor of 1 cigar equal to 2 gm of tobacco.
